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The Hilt champions pinot noir and chardonnay from the climate margins of California's coastal winegrowing regions, with –Sta. Rita Hills and Santa Barbara County's AVA's prominent among them. The philosophy of "growing in the margins" propels wine growers to employ practices that enable grapes to show full transparency of site—key to The Hilt's philosophy.

As hinted at in the name, The Hilt goes "all the way " in its quest for expression and quality; nothing is held back in terms of effort.

Soft and fragrant fruit lingers on the acid-driven finish alongside gentle, chalky tannins. A beautiful and pure pinot noir right out of the gates. –Winemaker-Matt Dees
